Generate Ideas
Read the heading on this page aloud to children. Then ask them to share what they know about objects that appear in the daytime sky. List their ideas on the board, and return to this list after reading this page and the next.

Active Reading Main Idea
Explain that the main, or most important, idea may be the first sentence in a paragraph. Or, it may be a different sentence. Active readers ask themselves, "What is this paragraph mostly about?" The answer will be the main idea.

Develop Science Concepts
Point out that the biggest difference between day and night is light. **Where does daylight come from?** It comes from the sun. **Why is the sky dark at night?** There is no sun providing light.
Read the first three sentences aloud. **Which sentence states the main idea? How do you know?** The second sentence states the main idea because it tells what the rest of the paragraph is about.
Point out that the rest of the page has details about things in the daytime sky. **What things might you see in the daytime sky?** the sun, clouds, and maybe the moon.

Look up! You can see many things in the daytime sky. You can see the sun. The sun is the star closest to Earth. A star is an object in the sky. It gives off its own light. The sun gives light and heat to Earth.

You may also see clouds in the daytime sky. Sometimes, you can even see the moon.

Active Reading
The main idea is the most important idea about something. Draw two lines under the main idea.

Differentiation—Leveled Questions

<p>Extra Support How do you know that the sun is a star? I know the sun is a star because it is an object in the sky that gives off light.</p>	<p>Enrichment Why is it difficult to see the moon in the daytime when the sky is sunny? The sun is so bright that it makes it difficult to see the moon.</p>

What can you see in the daytime sky? Look out your window. Draw what you see.

Drawings will vary but should be reasonable representations of what children can see in the daytime sky.

Writing Connection

Write a Sentence Share the poem "Star Light, Star Bright" with children:

Write this sentence starter on the board and help children read it:

Have children draw a picture about a wish they might make and then copy and complete the sentence describing this wish.

Develop Science Vocabulary

sun Write the words sun and sunny on the board. Explain that sun is a naming word, or noun. Explain that sunny is a describing word, or adjective, that tells what it's like when the sun is shining. Have children use both words in a sentence.

star Explain that the word star comes from the Greek word aster and the Latin word stella. **What do you think the girl's name Stella might mean?** star

Misconception Alert

Children may think that the sun moves across the sky. Explain that the sun stays in one place while Earth rotates. Demonstrate by attaching a sticky note to mark the children's approximate location on a globe. Using the globe and a flashlight, rotate the globe and have children identify when they would see a daytime and a nighttime sky where they live.

Develop Inquiry Skills

INFER Is the sun still in the sky on a stormy day? How do you know? Yes; you know this because the sun is always in the daytime sky, although sometimes it is hidden behind clouds.

Summarize Ideas

Ask children to look back at the photos and think about the main idea they learned about the daytime sky. Have them summarize this idea orally with partners by completing this sentence: "In the daytime, the sky _____."
